NEW HOPE'S MISSION

I have to admit that the genealogies of the Old Testament are usually sections of the Bible that I scan or simply skip over. Especially when I read the old King James Version, all the "begats" left me bewildered at best and uninspired and uninterested at worst. Recently, though, I've gained a new appreciation for these passages.

Last month my wife, Jean, and I spent a few days in the Netherlands. During one of the days we drove to the province of Groningen from where both of our ancestors emigrated, Jean's in the mid 1800's and mine in the latter part of the century. Several years ago my Uncle sent me our families genealogy. I can trace my lineage to the early 1600's:

You'll notice that the surname "Norden" did not appear until 1794 when Napoleon required all the citizens of the Netherlands to adopt a surname. Where all of this became especially meaningful last month was when Jean and I stopped at the church in which my great-grandparents 8 generations back were married. I don't over-exaggerate when I say that it was a "holy moment" as I stood on the same ground on which they were married.

Standing in the environs of the old Dutch church in Oosternieland gave me a sense of rootedness, both in life and in faith. And my faith in the providence and goodness of God was affirmed yet again.



Dear New Hope Members and Friends:

I'm very happy to have an opportunity to bring everyone up to speed on what's been happening from the CA's office for the last month or so! The activity level remains busier than you may imagine (at least more so than I'd imagined!) but may be starting to slow down a bit.

I'd like to share a few highlights with you here. If you have been following the financial information as presented in previous newsletters, you will have noted that our financial position has remained relatively strong so far this year. We are grateful to the Lord for His many blessings! Financial reports for both April and May are included below. In April, please note that our Total Income (\$158,074) exceeded Total Expense (\$81,642) by over \$76,000. Total tithes and offerings are often higher due to Easter, but in addition, monthly expenses in April were a bit lower than usual at \$81,642.

Giving dropped significantly in May with Total income at \$87,301 while expense ran somewhat higher (approximately 4 percent over budget primarily due to technology support services). Overall year-to-date (YTD) income exceeds expenses by nearly \$30,000. We continue to maintain one and a half months of operating expenses in our Operations Reserve Fund



(currently \$147,000) in addition to our Capital Reserve Fund (\$74,693.51) which you may recall was established just over a year ago.

I would also highlight that as of May 31, 2018, New Hope has paid over \$42,000 in benevolences (8.34 percent of YTD giving). We continue to look forward to sharing God's love by assisting various ministries and helping others through our benevolence program.

In addition to the financial update, we are in the process of addressing a number of facility-related items including working with contractors to manage our building and grounds maintenance, roof and electrical concerns, technology issues, as well as some exciting plans for interior renovations.

Overall, I remain committed to looking for ways we might increase or improve our ability to serve Christ and be good stewards of the resources we have here at New Hope.

Last, but not least, I want to take this opportunity to thank the entire New Hope Staff for their amazing dedication, hard work and desire to serve our Lord, our congregation and our community. It is truly a joy each day to work with Pastor Steve, Pastor Sarah, Ministry Leaders and each member of our talented staff - Thanks one and all!

ENDOWMENT FUND GRANT UPDATE

The New Hope Endowment Fund has awarded grants to the following eight organizations:

New Hope Children's Ministry – to reconfigure what was the "Toddler Room" into an older youth space by purchasing age-appropriate furniture. Also providing a child with special needs a chair that will accommodate her needs while in that space.

Hope Hollow – Hope Hollow provides prayers, lodging, meals, transportation assistance, emotional support, at no cost, to cancer patients, their families and friends, who are financially in need, while traveling to Columbus for their cancer treatment.

Coats 4 Children – to provide new coats to economically disadvantaged children in the Central Ohio area.

Seven Baskets – to provide a Summer Day Camp program that helps disadvantaged children living in the Thunderbird Acres neighborhood. It provides food, educational enrichment, and bible study.

Marmon Valley Farms – to provide scholarships to children who wish to attend the Summer Camp programs. These programs provide bible study along with the opportunity to ride horses. They also seek to connect kids without home churches to churches in their area.

Franklinton Rising – to provide valuable construction skills and Christian growth to young adults in the Franklinton area. The goal is to build Christians and provide job skills that will make them employable.

Kindway – to provide funds for their Embark program which helps provide Christian growth and mentorship to those who are incarcerated. It also provides transitional help for those who are leaving the penal system.

Grace Clinic -to provide free dental care along with Christian support to those in need in the Delaware area. Sue Moberger is one of the dentists who gives her time to help those in need.
