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### **NEW HOPE'S MISSION**

It's a new year and I imagine that many of us have resolved to start doing things and stop doing others. I'm writing this on the second day of January so, since this column is late by nearly a week and one half, perhaps I should resolve to be more timely in my submissions for the church newsletter!

It was over two decades ago that I was introduced to the writings of Steven Covey by my mother-in-law. One of Dr. Covey's more memorable quotes was "to live, to laugh, to love, to leave a legacy." That seems to be wise counsel for framing new year's resolutions. As we enter into this new year, I would encourage us to live more fully and exuberantly. I recognize that I may be more risk tolerant in some areas than other people, but I still find myself holding back and playing it safe in far too many areas of life. Mary Oliver's poem "When Death Comes" challenges me, particularly in its last lines.

"When it's over, I want to say: all my life

I was a bride married to amazement. I was the bridegroom, taking the world into my arms.

When it's over, I don't want to wonder

if I have made of my life something particular, and real.

I don't want to find myself sighing and frightened, or full of argument.

I don't want to end up simply having visited this world."

Are we all able to find more cause for laughter during this year? As I look around and observe what is happening in our culture, it appears that there is a pall of grim hopelessness that hangs over us like a dark cloud. We recently saw the movie "Mary Poppins Returns." It may be a function of age but I enjoyed the first edition so much more. The song Uncle Albert sang, "I Love to Laugh" fills me with mirth: "I love to laugh, long and loud and clear; I love to laugh, it's getting worse every year.

If you were with us on Christmas Eve, you heard me quote/sing a song composed by Hal David and Burt Bacharach that was popular over 50 years ago, "What the World Needs Now is Love." In a world that is filed with anger and polarizing language and behavior, I would invite us to love generously and extravagantly with a love that's not just for some but for everyone.

Finally, and most significantly, I would challenge us to consider the legacy we leave. With that, I hope that you join us in worship over these next several Sundays as we consider together what it means to live a significant life. There is so much that distracts and deters us from leaving a legacy of significance, so much so that Jesus' words "for what will it profit them to gain the whole world and forfeit their life?" are incredibly haunting.

May you and yours enjoy all of God's greatest blessings in this new year as you live, laugh, love and leave a legacy!



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
## Upcoming Women's Bible Studies


"God Save the Queen: An Exploration of the Book of Esther"

The last several months have been difficult for our family. We lost my beloved grandfather, Mark's treasured grandmother, and tragically lost Mark's best friend from college to a heart attack. Grief and joy have been close friends in our lives recently. Where one exists, the other follows closely behind. As painful as this season has been in our lives, it has also been a beautiful season of deep reflection and honesty. So as we begin another year, I wanted to share with you things we have gleaned from the losses of 3 of the most esteemed people in our lives.



Poppa - My Grandfather: He is one of the most remarkable men I have ever known. He possessed gifts that in our current cultural climate seem to be incredibly

rare. One of the most beautiful things about my grandfather: he could disagree with you on everything in this life, and yet you would still, no matter who you were, feel loved, respected, and cared for by him. Few people on this earth possess this gift, but he

did. He knew that it was the person that had value simply for who they were and who their Creator was; their value was not contingent on if they thought the same way he did, or believed in the same things.

Another thing I loved about my Poppa as I grew older was being given the gift of watching him live out his faith in Jesus through his actions and love for others. He never stopped caring for anyone who had the honor of being in his presence. And he NEVER stopped growing in his faith and seeking the Lord's face, or asking tough questions about his faith. At the beginning of this past year I went to visit him and there lay my Poppa, 94 years old, with a Bible study next to his bed because he was still actively pursuing a deeper relationship with His Father in Heaven. I tell this story to the youth at New Hope. I encourage them to look to a man who, even at 94 and 95 years old never stopped pursuing God, continued to ask tough questions, and to see that a beautiful life lived in faith is not one of perfection or knowing all of the answers, or one without doubt. A life of faith was lived out by my Poppa because of the imperfections, the unanswerable

questions, the doubts; and because he never let those things deter Him from seeking the face of the God who loves him.

her life to be of service to others. Her obituary made me laugh out loud because her service seemed to have no end. Grammie was 95 when she passed away. Until the moment she became sick this year she never stopped caring for those around her and serving her community using the specific gifts God gave her. She was an active member of her church, was a member of the Olivia Circle, PERI, Shelby County Farm Bureau, Sidney-Shelby County Senior Center, Tar Hollow volunteer, United Methodist Women, and Paws for Jesus dog trainer. She was a 4-H advisor for a total of 67 years for the Sow and Grow Club and PawPrints Dog Club. As you can see, she valued serving others.



Grammie understood that she was blessed to be a blessing, and lived her entire life understanding Christ's great call to give her life away in service and care for others. Lives were changed because of her devotion to them and not saying "No" or "Not now" when God called her to be His light in all facets of life.

goodbyes to Adam, we had the privilege of listening to his childhood friends share stories of Adam's life, his love and devotion to his wife and 4 young children, and the hope he had in Jesus. I continue to reflect on what one friend said, "Adam was the youngest of 3 brothers, so he was the first to introduce to all of us the "cool" things his older brothers

taught him. Things like: how to make a mixed tape, how to use call waiting, how to talk to a girl. But Adam was also the first of us to know the value of honesty. And he was the first to be honest about his struggles. He knew that when the stakes were high, he would want to be honest about his struggles, and his hope even in the darkest moments, was always found in Jesus." I share these stories because each of these people loved Jesus with all that they were here on earth; and now they get to love God and be loved by Him with all that they are in Heaven with Him for all of eternity.

I am so thankful that each of them knew Jesus this side of heaven. Their joys were all the more joy-filled, and their sorrows were never experienced alone.

After walking this road of grief for several months now it has only made me more acutely aware that I want all of our loved ones, and even those we don't understand, to know the hope we have in Jesus, to know and understand the love He has for us, for them...no matter what. What a treasure knowing Jesus is. Living our lives filled with gratitude for His unending love for us, we can reach out and serve a world that is hurting and has little hope.

As a church body we encourage our youth to love and serve God by loving, serving, and caring for others in our church and in the community.

So I encourage you: find a place to serve, give of your time and talents, never stop asking questions and growing in your faith, show kindness to all people regardless of whether you understand them or not, love people without an agenda, and by your life's successes and failures share the hope you have in Jesus. It matters.


The Nursery is filled with amazing little disciples hungry for *Goldfish*! We are always accepting donations as we cannot seem to keep the bowl full!

Felipe and Janelle's ministry provides youth in Dallas with an environment where they can experience safety and respect, develop life skills and character, pursue education, and come to know the love of Christ.
