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NEW HOPE'S MISSION

To **Reach** people for Christ, **Root** people in Christ, and **Release** people to serve Christ.

The three offices of Elder, Deacon and Minister of the Word, being joined together in Consistory, thus continue within the Church the unity of these offices in Christ, as so many branches flourishing on the same Vine. In this manner, all things in the Church will be done decently and in order, when faithful people are chosen, according to the rule prescribed in the Word of God. (Liturgy of the Reformed Church in America)

But all things should be done decently and in order. (1 Corinthians 14:40)

Decently and in order. That is one of the cardinal principles of our presbyterial form of church government. One would hope that this would be a cardinal principle of our public government also, although sometimes one is left to wonder. When matters are done decently and in order, God's "business" is accomplished well, God's people are respected for their varying opinions and God's purposes among us flourish.

Consistory (your church board) recently spent some significant time in conversation about how we conduct our business decently and in order, particularly in our Town Meetings. Ordinarily, our Town Meetings are quite routine but on rare occasions we must consider matters that are somewhat complicated. It is for that reason that we abide by Robert's Rules of Order (newest edition) in our Town Meetings.

I recognize and understand that many people are unfamiliar with

parliamentary procedure. Unless one has experience in assemblies where parliamentary procedure is practiced, it can become complicated and even intimidating. I have had the opportunity to serve as parliamentarian for the International Conference of Police Chaplains for over a decade and on two occasions for the General Synod of the Reformed Church in America. I'm one of those unusual types who actually enjoy parliamentary procedure!

Especially in our Town Meetings, I will endeavor to guide us carefully through the ins and outs of parliamentary procedure. To help us conduct our business decently and in order, Consistory is making this request: If you intend to make a motion in a Town Meeting that is more than a simple motion (for example to adjourn the meeting) or one that is more than one or two sentences, please make sure that the motion is written before it is presented to the body. That will permit me to read the motion and then to present the motion to a person at our sound/projection booth so that it can be read by all present at the Town Meeting. We anticipate this will bring greater clarity to our deliberations.

We value everyone's participation in our Town Meetings. We want to provide access to involvement for all present. And, following the counsel of the Apostle Paul, we want to ensure that God's "business" is done decently and in order. Join us for our next Town Meeting April 7.

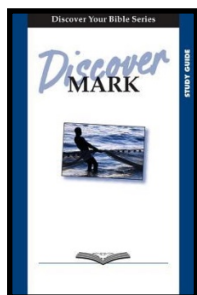

Through May 8

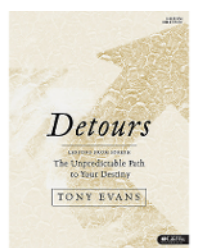

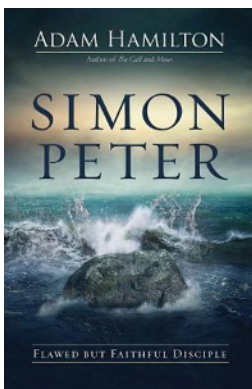
Parenting: Is That Poop on My Arm?

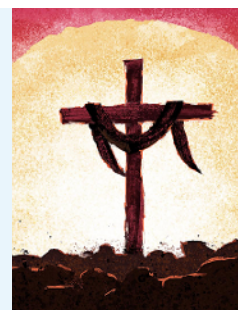
Jesus: Understanding His Death & Resurrection

Each week one of our high school youth has been leading the devotion during youth group to both middle and high school youth. The stories they share about their life, their faith, their failures, and the confidence they have in the Lord is astounding.

We can all learn something from our youth. Their level of transparency and honesty is refreshingly beautiful and freeing. I could not be more proud of them! Owen Schultz has given me permission to share his devotion with the congregation.

"Hello, for those of you who don't know me my name is Owen Schultz, and I am a sophomore at Dublin Coffman High School. I'm very excited that Lindsey gave me this opportunity to talk to you guys about my life and my faith. I hope that you guys can hear my story and it helps you in some small way. I'm going to be real and vulnerable with you guys, and to be honest I'm a little nervous, so I just ask that you pay attention. So, when I was growing up I always wanted to be good at sports, but I was never really anything more than mediocre even though I tried tons of different sports. I blame my dad by the way; did not win the genetic lottery there. I tried out for a ton of different travel teams for several different sports, but I never made any of them. It didn't feel good. I felt like a failure. Eventually I realized that I just couldn't put my worth in my athletic ability, so I moved on to focusing mostly on my academics. I hoped that if people knew me as the "smart kid" they would want to talk to me.

But nobody really wants to be around the person who acts like he's smarter than them, so this only pushed people away.

However, I still had a few close friends, so I subconsciously decided to put my worth in them. I thought, If my friends like me, I'm still valuable as a person. But as some of you may have experienced, putting all your value in the opinions of another person will always end terribly. For me, it destroyed my self confidence and just made things really difficult for a while. At the beginning of freshman year, I was pushing through the first few months of high school, still trying to figure out what was going on at this new place and I began to notice that my best friend since first grade was acting a little bit cold towards me. He would cut conversations short when I tried to talk to him at football games and was generally passive-aggressive towards me. Eventually I texted him to ask what was wrong. He wouldn't give a straight answer and eventually I called him. On that call he straight up told me he didn't want to be friends anymore. I was crushed. I had to do a lot of hiding my tears for the weeks after that horrible phone call. It felt like my life was crashing down around me. Everything that I thought I could trust suddenly came into question. It was really hard to go to school because I felt alone for so long.

While this was all happening I was meeting a lot of new people because I had joined the rowing team and they've told me recently that I barely talked that fall season. These are some of the people I am now closest with and I could barely talk to them because I was trapped in a permanent state of fear and distrust. It may seem like an overreaction but it was so hard to have the one person I thought I could count on suddenly give up on me. A major pillar of my life instantaneously crumbled to the

ground and I had to scramble to keep from falling with it. Then I was petrified that everything else I had built up would fail on me to. There were some times where I almost considered giving up. Now God has built a new pillar that is able to fully support me if another important part of my life fails and I don't need to be scared of losing everything because I will have him for eternity. But I'm getting ahead of myself.

For some context about my faith at this period, it basically ended at the doors of the church. I said I was a Christian, but it was really only because I was forced to. I had some friends at the church but I would do anything I could to avoid coming a lot of the time. For a while, I didn't have much to fall back onto. I bet most of you have heard the church song they teach to little kids that says "The wise man built his house upon the rock" and "The foolish man built his house upon the sand." That's way more true than I ever realized. Building your life on anything that isn't God is certain to end with everything crashing down. My life was built on that sinking sand, so I was really struggling for the beginning of last year until the youth group went to Genesis in Michigan. I vividly remember a passing comment that Emma Wilson, who graduated last year, made after we played cards. She just said "Schultz is fun". That's it. She didn't even know I was struggling at that time, and she wasn't trying to change my life, but that little comment made me feel like I belonged to something for the first time in a long long time.

I never really made a strict decision to take my faith more seriously, but as I continued to hang out with all these awesome

people at the church and at Young Life I absorbed what we were taught and gradually decided to live for God. Everything in my life became different. When I went to Young Life Camp, there was this 30 foot telephone pole called the Pamper Pole. I'm pretty sure it was called that because you needed a diaper because it was going to make you poop your pants. The idea was you climbed up it and jumped off to grab a bar. But the hardest part was keeping your balance as you tried to stand on the small, shaky top platform. I imagine if you stood up there long enough you would forget what it was like to stand on the firm solid ground.

This is what my life was like without that firm foundation. I was struggling to keep my balance and eventually I fell. But the nice thing about the pole was if you fall there was a rope to catch you and lower you back down. I'm so lucky that God was able to catch me and carry me back to the firm, solid ground. When I was in confirmation, my mentor, Brandon Lewis encouraged me to search the Bible for a single verse to memorize. After searching Google for "good Bible verses", The verse I chose was Jeremiah 29:11, which says "For I know the plans I have

for you," declares the LORD, "plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans to give you hope and a future." I remembered this verse during this time period I've been talking about, and it reminded me that God's intent was not to harm me and as long as I stayed in him I would always have hope for my future. God will never abandon me like that friend did and he will always let me return to his solid ground.

Since joining young life and becoming more involved here I have found so many great people who actually care about me and don't look at their friends as trophies they can display to show how "popular" they are. The number of real conversations I've had in the last year dwarfs all of the years before that combined. The way that I got my life in control was to give up control to God. Another verse I memorized recently after it was the focus of our Young Life Campaigner Day, which is a day-long conference with a bunch of speakers, but they each incorporated this verse into their talks. The verse is John 16:33. It says "I have told you these things, so that in me you may have peace. In this world you will have trouble. But take heart! I have overcome the world." I think that

we don't focus enough as Christians on the fact that there will be hard times in our life. The Bible straight up says that life is going to be hard. But we have the creator of the entire world on our side. The powers of the devil cannot hurt me as long as God, who has overcome all earthly things, is on my side. There's even an exclamation point. I could be wrong but I don't think there are very many exclamation points in the Bible, so it really sticks out as important to me. God has overcome the world, so we don't need to stress about the trouble in our lives too much. So I want to leave you guys with this last verse. It says "I have been crucified with Christ and I no longer live, but Christ lives in me. The life I now live in the body I live by faith in the son of God, who loved me and gave himself for me" and that's in Galatians chapter 2 verse 21. This is the verse that I try to live by, and I'm far from perfect. I'm still trying to learn to truly love this book, let go of my pride and be willing to give up everything I have to pour into others and God. But my old uncertain life of betrayal is gone because the person I have now put my trust in is actually worthy of that trust, and that's really made everything so much better."

I grew up listening to my Dad read us Bible stories every night at bed time. Dad often let us pick the story for the evening. My favorite story came from Exodus with the plague of the frogs. I loved the pictures of the frogs in the old picture Bible we had. It showed the frogs coming out of everywhere! My Dad must have read it at least 100 times.

Recently, I had the opportunity to discuss the Bible with my Dad, who is now 74 years old. I was amazed to reflect on how those nightly 10 minute reads played such an instrumental part in who I am as a child of God; and how my father viewed his role in parenting children of God.

He knew his job was to share God's story with us. We (there are 4 of us) are blessed to have parents who shared not only God's story with us, but also His Word.

Deuteronomy 6:5-9 tells us, *Love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your strength. Take to heart these words that I give you today. Repeat them to your children. Talk about them when you're at home or away, when you lie down or get up. Write them down, and tie them around your wrist, and wear them as headbands as a reminder. Write them on the doorframes of your houses and on your gates.*

Spend some time in the Bible with your children. A few minutes will impact their entire lives.
