I confess that there are occasions when I submit my newsletter article at the last moment. More often than not, this is because I find it difficult to write something fresh and creative that hasn't been written in a previous newsletter article during the past 35 years. Writers block is real and it plagues me frequently. But this month's article is simply too hard to write for other reasons.

For the past 20 years Nancy Green has served as New Hope Church's Office Administrator. She is often the first face a person sees upon entering our building or the first voice they hear when the church phone is answered. To say that Nancy has served New Hope spectacularly well over the past 20 years simply does not convey the magnitude of her value. Nancy has been a steadying influence, a listening ear to many, the one who keeps staff on task and focused and a colleague upon whom we've all come to rely significantly. Nancy's empathy has welcomed and touched many. Her kindness and compassion are generous and ubiquitous.

Nancy and I have often reminisced about her hesitation in coming to work for New Hope. In early 2000, as she considered this opportunity she was told by our then chair of the Personnel Committee that I was hard to work for. In conversations between the chair of the committee, Nancy and me we came to understand that I have high expectations for every staff member at New Hope. Nancy not only has met those expectations, she has exceeded them greatly.

I wonder how many remember what a different church New Hope was 20 years ago. Nancy and I characterize us back then as a "mom and pop" operation. We were in the "Polar Bear Church" and Nancy's office and mine were adjoining with a door between us. This was before the internet, cell phones, text messages and the like. We did have an answering machine that Nancy would check daily but most of our communication was simply talking to each other loudly (for my sake) through the open door between our offices.

It goes without saying that the only person who knows me better than Nancy is my wife, Jean. Nancy could write a book about my idiosyncracies, my faults, my limitations and more. Still, she has always accepted me and cared for me in spite of these. I know that Nancy has disagreed with several of the decisions I've made over the past 20 years, particularly as they relate to staff members of New Hope. While she was always willing to share her opinions, never did she undermine me or speak behind my back. Nancy was as loyal and trustworthy as the day is long. For that, I will be forever grateful.

Whenever someone of Nancy's tenure leaves, the natural response is to wonder if the institution will survive. I'm grateful that our new Office Administrator, Melissa Brady who has been working with Nancy for several weeks, has proved herself capable and already has become a valuable and valued member of our staff team. I hope you'll greet Melissa warmly when you meet her.

It hardly seems possible that 20 years has passed since Nancy began with us at New Hope. The time has flown by, to use the Apostle Paul's words, "in a twinkling of an eye." I didn't want to write this article and I'm still not happy about it. But I am very happy for Nancy as she and her husband, Tim, move into a new phase of their life in beautiful western Montana.

I've thought long and hard about parting words for Nancy. It was 35 years ago that I first heard Michael W Smith's song "Friends." And so, I offer these words as an expression of my deep admiration and affection for the dear friend Nancy is to me:

Packing up the dreams God planted In the fertile soil of you I can't believe the hopes He's granted Means a chapter of your life is through But we'll keep you close as always It won't even seem you've gone 'Cause our hearts in big and small ways Will keep the love that keeps us strong


If you are looking for a space to ask questions and discuss the biblical passages you're reading

This year New Hope will be focusing on a variety of hands-on projects, especially the care and up-keep of the church building and surrounding grounds. The projects will provide many opportunities to serve. We will be reaching out for volunteers throughout the year.

The current projects are:

- In preparation for our Easter Services, the first project on Saturday, April 4th, the youth will be tending to the flower beds, laying mulch and weeding. We are requesting 50 adult volunteers to assist the youth with this project.
- Next we will be assisting Habitat for Humanity with the building of walls, for a family in need of a home. This project will take place in the church's parking lot on May 15th and 16th. This Wall Build will require the support of 75-100 volunteers.
- When the weather turns warmer, we will be heading outside to paint the first floor of the building. The youth have offered to help but will need volunteers to assist with this large project. More info to follow.
